BRIEF SYLLABUS 38:578:526 Immigration, Public Policy, and Worker Rights

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The role of immigrant labor in contemporary society and accompanying public policy debates. Theories of migration, history of migration and migration policy in the US; labor market dynamics in immigrant-dominated industries. Existing employment and labor rights of immigrant workers. Community, labor, and immigrant organizations' efforts to improve wages, working conditions, and immigration policy.
