Course Description:

Immigration and immigrant workers in American society and related public policy debates; history; immigrants in unions and community organizations.

Important information:

This course is suitable for non-majors as well as majors or minors. There are no pre-requisites. This course counts toward the Core Curriculum 21C requirement.
