

INVITING RELATIVES OTHER THAN VISA DEPENDENTS AS VISITORS

If you wish to invite a member of your family to come to the United States on a B-2 visitor visa, you may wish to follow the steps below. Please keep in mind the suggested procedure is for visitor applications only. It should **not** be used for a spouse or dependent child. Spouse and dependent children should come to the United States in a derivative status such as F-2, J-2, or H-4.

1. Write a letter (see template below) to the nonimmigrant visa officer in which you:
 - a) Indicate the expected length of the visit and a preferred arrival date
 - b) Indicate pertinent biographical information of the visitors [e.g., name, relationship to you, place (city and country) and date of birth]
 - c) If you wish to add information regarding your income as evidence of your ability to support your visitor during his or her stay in the U.S., give all appropriate information in the "Additional information/comments" section. It is a good idea to provide supporting documentation for anything you say (letter from your department indicating that you have an assistantship, bank statement, etc.)
 - d) Date and sign the form
2. Request a Certification of Enrollment or obtain other certification of full-time enrollment at Rutgers from the Registrar's Office: <https://transcripts.rutgers.edu/transcripts/getVerificationForm.tcr>.

The following template in combination with proof of your enrollment at Rutgers serves the same purpose as an individually typed letter. Your family should include all relevant documents in their visa application, and/or take the documents with them for the visa interview.
