Course Description:

Role of Latino workers in U.S. society and the U.S. economy; impact of recent migration on the U.S. labor market and social policy.

Important information:

This course is suitable for non-majors as well as majors or minors. There are no pre-requisites. This course counts toward the Core Curriculum 21C requirement. It also counts as an elective for the HRM major. It is offered both online and in-person.
